In Quebec, only about 65% of students who enter CEGEP end-up graduating with a DEC.

- That may surprise you, but it shouldn't.
- The fact is, most students leaving high school are not prepared for CEGEP.

- They were told when and how to study, never becoming self-directed learners.

Over 85% of Centennial College students obtain their DEC and go on to university.

Our goal

We coach our students to help them develop the skills and self-confidence they need to become autonomous, resilient, life-long learners. Our results speak for themselves: over 85% of our students complete their DEC and are accepted into university.

Our programs

We are an English-language, independent, post-secondary college. We offer pre-university programs in Social Sciences and Commerce. We also offer one-year bridging programs to students who wish to pursue pre-university studies in Commerce or Sciences but who did not complete the pre-requisite courses in high school.

Unique to Centennial

C-Space

This is a mandatory one-hour period, per course, per week, in which students independently study, complete assignments and have access to their teacher for coaching and feedback. C-Space gives students the opportunity to practice learning, ask questions and seek guidance.

Student Success Workshops

Our Student Success team facilitates weekly workshops about effective learning behaviours. They provide students with strategies for developing skills such as autonomy, perseverance, time management, organization and planning, balanced lifestyles, self-advocacy, and stress management: the keys to success in college and university.
